LeGate Endowment

Dr. JoEllen Koerner, LeGate Chair of Nursing and Allied Health, will demonstrate computerized, scenario-based simulation training designed for nursing education to Nursing Division faculty, selected students, and LeGate Committee members on November 8. Simulis™ has applied web-based technology to design a clinical reasoning system that invites the learner to:

- interact with a patient scenario,
- assess the situation,
- select appropriate interventions,
- see their decision's impact, in real time, upon the patient through a virtual dashboard.

The use of scenarios before clinical experience focuses the attention of the student on a specific patient population, maps their performance, and gives faculty a map to guide the student experience while on the unit. Real time feedback connects the student to information missed so they can 'catch themselves thinking'. Faculty can also see reasoning patterns that are not visible through subjective observation, while they are able to extend their expertise to a group of students.

The Estate of Mr. James LeGate provides funding for the LeGate Chair of Nursing and Allied Health, as well as nursing student scholarships in excess of \$20,000 annually.
