Re: Reading Placement Proposal

I am pleased to forward the recommendation of the reading task force to the curriculum committee for consideration and adoption.

Specifically, the proposal is:

1. All students enrolling in courses numbered 100 and above (unless otherwise exempted) must demonstrate proficiency in reading by scoring at least 70 on the COMPASS reading placement assessment or comparable reading placement assessment. Students scoring below 70 would be required to successfully complete ENG 083 before enrolling in college level courses. It is strongly recommended that students enroll in ENG 140 if they score between 70 and 84 in the placement test.

For reference, a score of 70 corresponds to an ~~eight ninth grade reading level~~ and a score of 84 corresponds to an eleventh grade reading level. As we implement the reading requirement we must also allow for provisions to exempt courses from the requirement (for example—backpacking, beginning swimming....) and grandfather students into classes (for example—has a degree....). Thus, I am also suggesting that the committee approve the following:

2. The curriculum committee may exempt, upon application by discipline/department, specific courses from this reading requirement thereby allowing for the possibility of enrolling in the course without having to meet the reading requirement or concurrent enrollment with ENG 083.
3. Students who have successfully completed 12 credit hours of ~~college 100 level and/or above of academic~~ coursework with a 2.0 average or students who possess a minimum of an Associate's degree from a ~~recognized regionally accredited~~ institution of higher learning will be deemed to have met the reading placement requirement for college level classes.
