2018-19 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Verde Valley Campus Building L

Work continues enclosing the first-floor entrance by installing structural steel and new flooring to support the simulator lab space. Concrete polishing is nearing completion in the Science Labs along with the installation of fire sprinklers and HVAC ductwork and piping. Framing is also underway for the new student break out study spaces. On the second floor, framing is underway to enclose the hallway and prepare for the new roof.

Building 32 Second floor Refresh and Improvements

Building 32 is another project to be almost entirely completed with the Facilities and ITS teams. Construction started the week of November 25 and will continue through December 16, renovating the west side of the building paint, carpeting, lighting, and door hardware. December 16 and 17, work will be occurring in the lobby. Demolition and framing of new walls on the east side of the building along with installing lobby flooring will occur December 18 through January 4. The remaining renovation of the east side of 32 will occur January 6 and wrap up on or about March 3.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS PLANNED MAINTENANCE PROJECTS

As part of the budget, planned maintenance projects are scheduled each year to ensure that College facilities are maintained at a level to support optimum performance in building systems, infrastructure, life safety, roadways, and parking, along with College grounds. These projects are the result of a recent Facilities Condition Assessment (FCA), which identifies when repairs, modifications, or replacement of components should occur.
