Pavla writes to us: I currently play professional basketball in Germany, DBBL Division 2-North, for TSV Quakenbrueck, in Quakenbrueck, Germany. I left Yavapai for a basketball scholarship to IPFW in Fort Wayne, IN and played 2 more years of D1-NCAA collegiate basketball, graduating from Purdue University with a bachelor's in electrical engineering and a minor in mathematics. I also presided as Vice President of IPFW's chapter of the National Society of Black Engineers, and am

currently an active Region IV alumni member. I am also an INROADS alumna from the Great Lakes Region, having worked two summers for the Carrier Corporation, a subsidiary of United Technologies, as an industrial quality engineer and as an electrical and software engineer in advanced manufacturing.
