








What is

Civic

Civic engagement can be many things, but in general it means to convene diverse groups of citizens to work together to make a difference in the civic life of their communities and developing the knowledge, skills, values and motivation to make a difference.

It means promoting the quality of life in a community, through both political and non-political processes.

Yavapai College's General Education Core Curriculum Outcomes (GECCO)statement on Civic Engagement

Civic Engagement is the active participation in the public life of the community in an informed, committed and constructive manner, with a focus on the common good.

Students who graduate with a degree or AGEC certificate from Yavapai College will be able to:

- Explain the evolving influences of social, economic, cultural, historical and/or political contexts of one's communities
- 2. Demonstrate skills of active citizenship
- 3. Relate individual motivations, values and ethics to effective participation in one's communities

A Definition of Service Learning:

The combination of classroom instruction with community service, focusing on critical, reflective thinking as well as personal and civic responsibility. Service learning programs involve students in activities that address communityidentified needs while developing their academic skills and commitment to their community.
