Faculty Compensation Schedule Change

In preparation for implementation of the 3% **District Governing Board** approved increase for the 2021-2022 academic year, preliminary analysis showed 10% or more of faculty would not achieve a full 3% increase due to reaching or exceeding top of grade (Step 19 in their respective grade). In lieu of supporting a Top of Grade bonus for these faculty, the HR Department recommended adding a step to the top of the faculty pay scale. This recommendation was approved by the ELT. Step 20 has been added to the faculty salary schedule which is located in the HR



discusses summer travel safety tips, long-term effects of COVID-19 and how caffeine and sleep can impact your day.


New Hire Referrals

Policy 3.08 Academic Records

As a reminder to faculty right before the end of Spring 2021, Academic Systems Operational Policy 3.08: Academic Records policy was changed to be in alignment with AZ State Records Retention Schedules as follows:

Full-time faculty will retain class grade records and course syllabi for <u>two</u> years.

Adjunct faculty will turn-in class grade records to the appropriated Division Office at the end of each semester. The grade records will be retained by the Division Office for a minimum of <u>two</u> full years. Copies of course syllabi must be retained by the Division Office for a minimum of <u>two</u> full years.

Juneteenth

In support of our equity value and President's Equity Taskforce focus, the ELT recently agreed to add another holiday to our YC offerings. Juneteenth, a federal holiday, will now be a paid holiday for all regular employees and 12-month faculty. The College will be closed that day in remembrance and celebration.

Juneteenth (officially Juneteenth National Independence Day and historically known as Jubilee Day, Emancipation Day, Freedom Day, and Black Independence Day) is now a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. Juneteenth will be celebrated annually on the 19th of June to mark the date when some of the last enslaved people in the Confederacy were notified of their freedom following the Civil War.

Emily Weinacker, CHRO, said, "This will be a great opportunity for YC to educate our students and employees on the history and meaning of this federal holiday."


