Yavapai College serves its students and the community at six locations, offering dozens of degrees and certificates that can lead to well-paying and fulfilling careers.

History

The College was approved by voters in 1966 and broke ground on its first campus in Prescott in 1968. The Verde Valley Campus was founded in 1968. Now with six locations, the College recently celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2018.

Governing Board

The Yavapai District Governing Board is comprised of five elected members representing district areas from across Yavapai County. The board meets regularly throughout the year and is tasked with making decisions that will support its three ends:

- Education
- Economic
- Community

In February 2019, Dr. Lisa B. Rhine became the tenth president of Yavapai College, bringing to the institution over 30 years of leadership experience across several leading colleges and universities in Ohio, Kentucky, and Virginia.

A Yavapai College Volunteer should:

- Be made to feel that the assistance they give is worthwhile and contributes to the overall success of the students, the College and the community
- Be treated with respect and consideration by all YC students, faculty and staff
- Be given a meaningful assignment in line with their areas of interest, skills, and if possible, convenience of location and available times
- Be given clear instructions, orientation, and any training necessary for volunteer activities
- Be given proper orientation to the work site with introductions to key personnel and information related to parking, storage of personal items, restrooms, and lunch facilities
- Be provided with direct support from faculty and staff

Time and Attendance

All volunteers must sign in and out at their assigned college work site. All volunteer areas must have a daily volunteer sign-in sheet. For security and safety reasons, and in case of an emergency, college administrators need to know who is present on campus and why. Please remind volunteers to sign-in and sign-out each time they visit their department. Keeping track of volunteer hours also enables the College to evaluate our Volunteer Program and recognize the value of our volunteers.

Dress:

Volunteers should dress professionally. However, individual departments may require specific attire.

Where to Report:

The manager of the work area will inform all volunteers of their work assignments and reveal all pertinent information and where to report. Volunteers will be given clear instructions, orientation, and any training necessary for volunteer activities. There will be a safe and secure area where you may leave your purses, coats, sweaters, and other items. Volunteers will be given a suitable assignment in line with their areas of interest, skills, and if possible, convenience of location and available times.

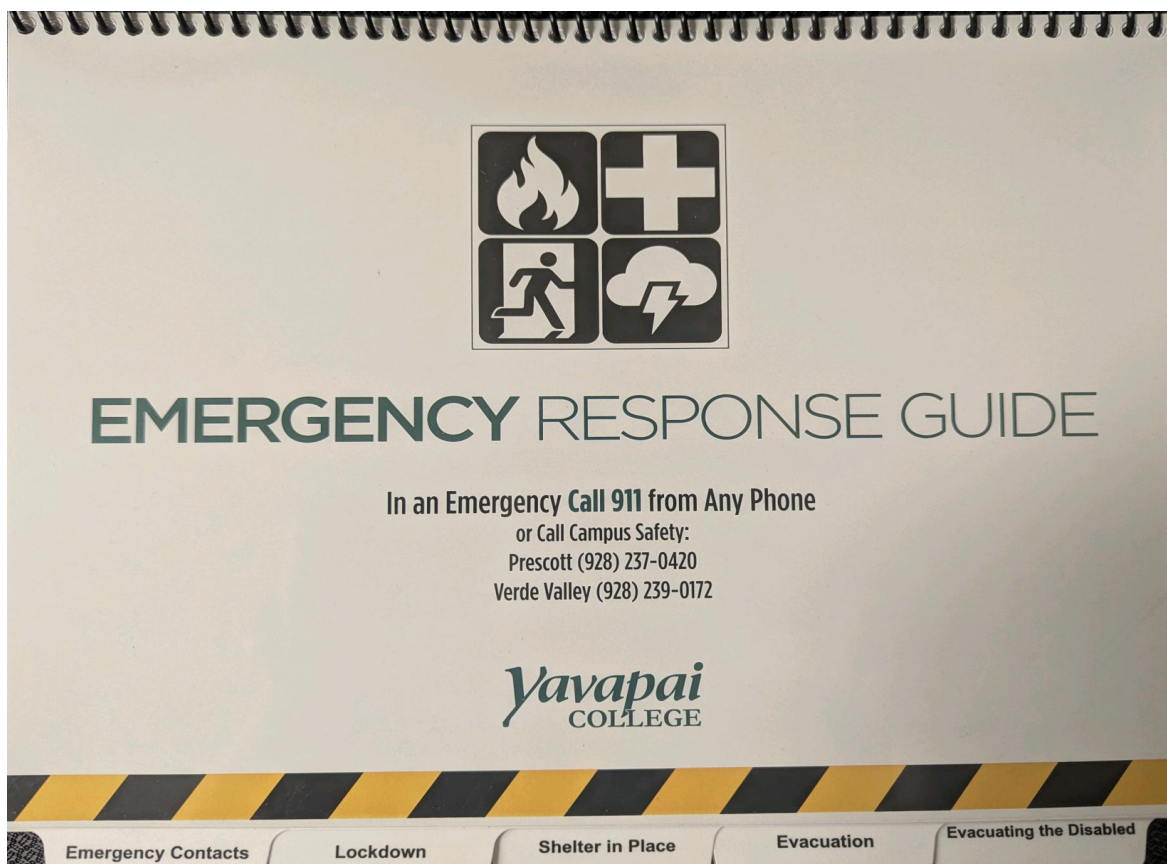
ALL volunteers *must park in the general parking area* (if applicable) and report to the manager. Please keep customer service in mind and refrain from parking in spaces closest to the work area. (Unless the space is considered necessary for the volunteer).

Training:

The YC College has an Emergency Response Plan (ERP). This plan is for the protection, safety, and well-being of the staff, volunteers, and patrons of the YC College. It identifies necessary staff and volunteer actions during fire and other emergencies. All Volunteers are required to adhere to the policies and procedures outlined in this guidebook, unless otherwise instructed by management. Information in this booklet should be read fully before the volunteer begins and referred to as needed so that a consistent, professional, and uniform set of expectations and procedures will be followed. A common-sense application of the principles contained in this guidebook will ensure that you, our faculty, and our staff have the best possible experience at Yavapai College.

We are counting on all confirmed volunteers for an event to be there. If there is an emergency that forces a volunteer to cancel at the last moment, she/he shall notify the manager assigned asap.



Yavapai College Privacy Policy

Yavapai College does not ask for personal information unless it is needed and does not share it with outside parties except to comply with the law or protect their rights. Personal e-mail addresses are only used to communicate with volunteers. Personal information, such as a volunteer's home address, telephone number, date of birth, and e-mail shall not be distributed to other members without the member's express consent, and may not be used for marketing purposes or as a distribution list for commercial purpose or private gain.

College Closures

Yavapai College is committed to providing a safe environment for all students, faculty, staff, volunteers, and visitors. While Yavapai College makes every attempt to maintain normal operating hours, from time to time inclement weather or infrastructures emergencies may necessitate delays of closure of the College.

In these situations, the College President and Campus Police will make the decision at the earliest possible time to allow faculty, students, staff and volunteers to plan accordingly. In most instances the college status will be communicated by 5:30 am. The decision will be based on actual conditions and/or forecasts with safety as the primary goal.

Please keep in mind that the decision to travel to Yavapai College is always a personal one and if you are not comfortable traveling in adverse conditions you should notify your manager your choice to stay home.

Please note that while the College does consider the status of local school districts in its decision, Yavapai College's response is independent of other schools or business.

Because many travel from afar, closures and delays apply to all campuses and centers district-wide (if Prescott is closed, so is Clarkdale, Sedona etc.).

FINGERPRINT CARDS

Why do I need a Fingerprint Clearance Card?

Arizona state law requires any person who participates in a teacher preparation program to obtain an "Identity Verified Print" (IVP) Fingerprint Clearance Card. Arizona school districts require that college students be fingerprinted before participating in field exercises at their schools.

How long is my Fingerprint Clearance Card valid?

Your Fingerprint Clearance Card is valid for six years.

Where can I obtain a Fingerprint Clearance Card?

Go to the following website <http://fieldprintarizona.com/> and follow the steps for enrolling, scheduling an appointment, and going to your appointment to have your fingerprints electronically scanned. Your card will be mailed to you in one-two weeks.

Other than personal information, what else do I need to know in order to complete my application?

When requesting your fingerprint clearance card, please make sure you specify you need the "IVP (Identity Verified Prints) Volunteer or Student" card under the "Why I need to be fingerprinted" section. Also, under the Sponsors section, choose "Teacher or Teacher Preparation Program."

Is there a fee?

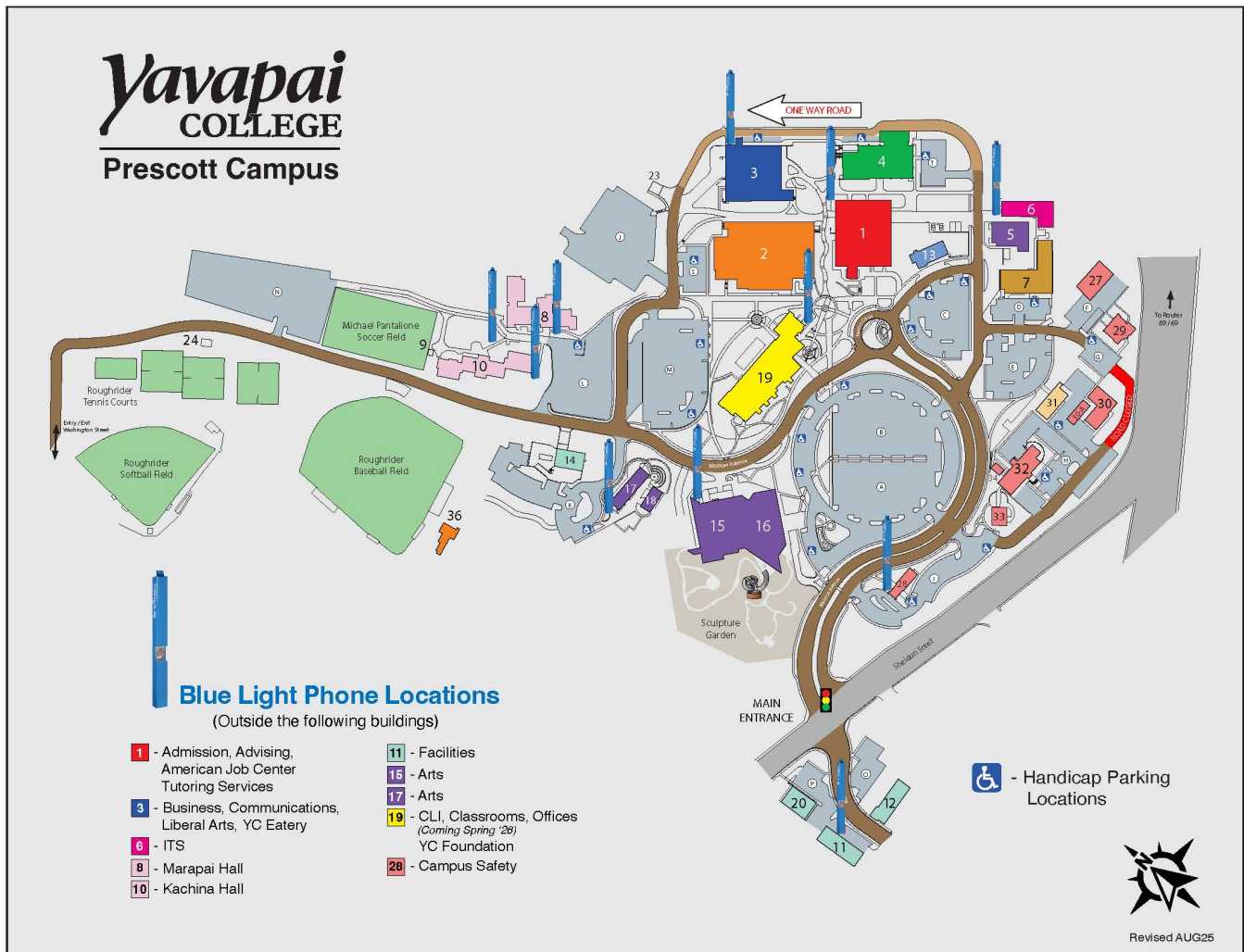
