

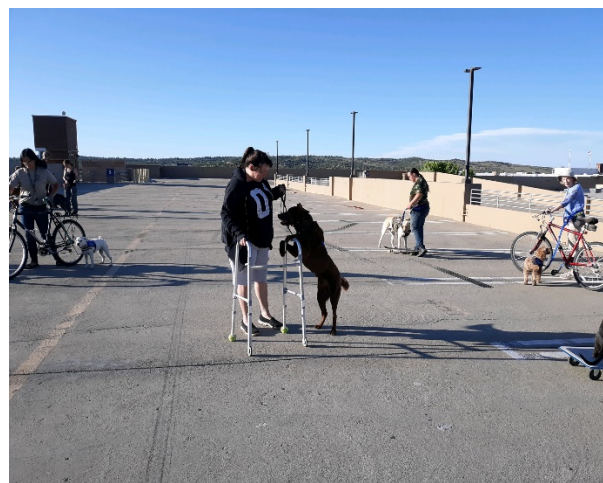
May 2021 Board Highlights

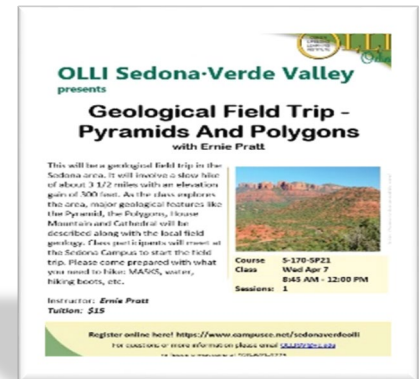


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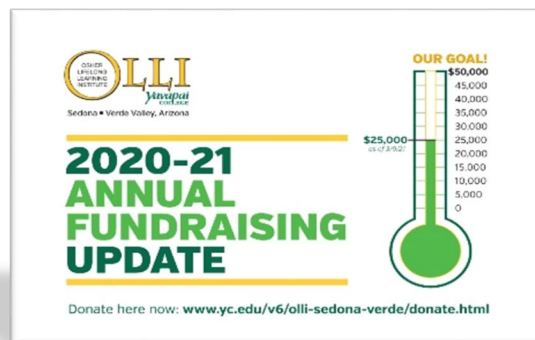


Lifelong Learning/OLLI/Community Education Highlights

- This June and July, Community Education Verde-Sedona spearheaded a new program for middle school and high school students — the College 4 Kids WRITING BOOTCAMP series. Six 8-hour courses will be available as face-to-face options for students who want to become excellent writers of engaging fiction. Scholarships are available through Prescott Community Education.
- Also In June and July, College 4 Kids programming will be available in the afternoons through Black Rocket, an online platform for children's education on a variety of popular STEM subjects, such as Minecraft, Youtube Video Creation, and more. A computer lab classroom will be available for parents to drop off their children so that they can take these exciting online classes with a supervisor on our campus.
- Prescott Community Education opened registration for the Prescott College for Kids program Monday, April 26, and classes begin Monday, June 7. Twenty-eight courses will be offered this summer for kids ages 5-17. Scholarships made available through generous donations from the Margaret T. Morris Foundation, The Arizona Community Foundation of Yavapai County and the Kiwanis Club of Prescott.

 - ✓ 2 Cooking classes will be held offsite in the kitchen at Mountain Oak Charter School.
 - ✓ 22 Classes will be held in person on the Prescott Campus.



- Cooking Classes and a variety of adult face-to-face and outdoor classes will also be announced soon, as well as four excellent cooking classes in June and July: Chocolate Tempering and Dipping, Holistic Chocolate Bars, Making Your Own Charcuterie Board, and Vegan Cheeses.

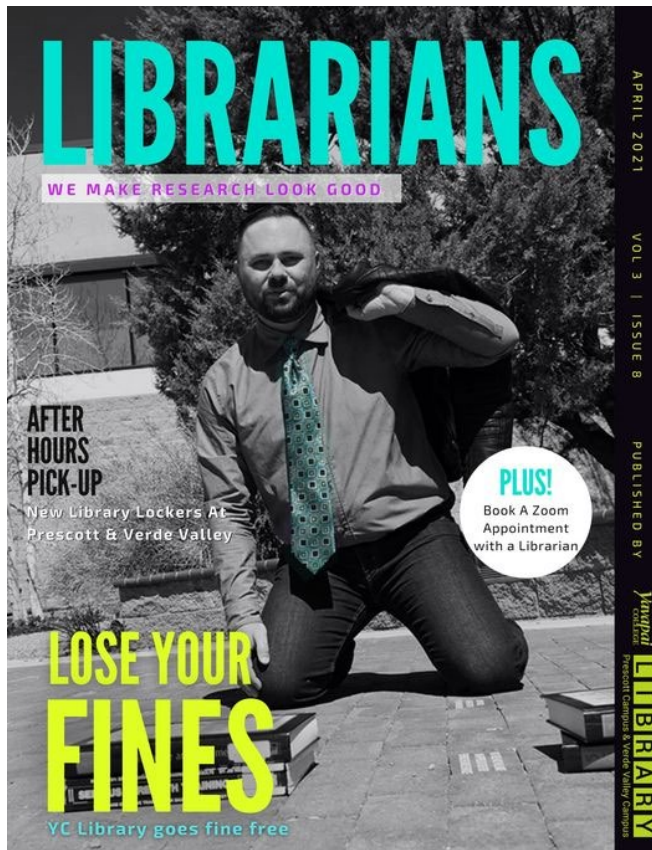

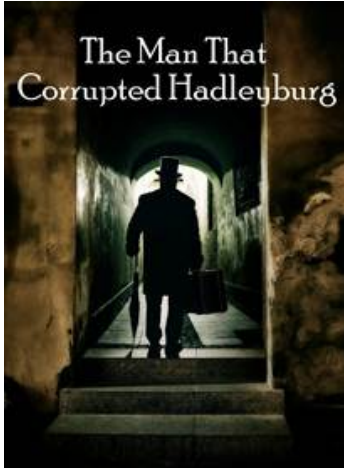


YC Performing Arts Center

- **Angel Guevara**, the first graduate from YC's four-course partnership with Spectrum Health Care, left a ten-year career as IT specialist with IBM in his native San Jose to go on a spiritual journey that led him to Sedona, Arizona. He later enrolled in courses at Yavapai College, graduating with an Associates of Gen. Studies in 2015, followed by an Associates in Human Social Services in 2017. Angel was hired by Spectrum Healthcare shortly after a summer internship for his AAS degree. His work in both the Men's and Women's residential substance abuse treatment programs has been a life calling. Angel says, "The Compassionate Care courses helped me to connect with people in a deeper and more genuine way, with presence, curiosity, neutrality, kindness, and empathy. All these qualities are innate, but the courses gave me the tools and methodologies to strengthen these qualities more skillfully, thus enhancing true human connection of compassion." As Spectrum's first YC Compassionate Care graduate, Angel will receive a \$500 bonus and increase in his hourly wage.



Although **Angel Guevara** is the first, **Dr. Tina Redd** points to **Professor Karly Way** as the key to the success of over 20 Spectrum students who will complete the program in May. Dr. Redd hopes the Board will join her in congratulating Angel, Professor Way, and all Spectrum Compassionate Care graduates for their hard work this year.
