CTE Verde Valley, Division 1






- In November, the Viticulture and Enology (VEN) program is leading a field trip for students to the prominent grape-growing regions in Southern Arizona. The trip includes a visit to Motzz Laboratories, which processes soil, water, and plant tissue samples for various agricultural industries, and meetings with alumni vineyard owners in the Sonoita and Willcox American Viticulture Areas (AVA). This excursion is designed to bridge classroom learning with real-world applications and industry networking.
- Graduates from the VEN program are being highlighted in the forthcoming documentary Vintage Arizona, which chronicles the careers of four distinguished winemakers, including three Yavapai College alumni. The Southwest Wine Center and our college vineyard served as key filming locations. The film's premiere is November 16th. The movie will further elevate the visibility of our program and its impact on the wine industry.

 The recent Verde Valley Job Fair brought together 113 registered job seekers and 32 employers, offering over 800 employment opportunities. The event resulted in 25 scheduled interviews, 80 resumes collected, and more than 20 applications submitted, marking a productive day for both job seekers and local employers.





Small Business Development Center (SBDC)

 Yavapai College Small Business Development Center (SBDC) celebrated entrepreneurship at the Yavapai-Apache Nation's Business Plan and Pitch competition, where Desert Ohana Plumbing emerged as the winner!

This inspiring event, hosted by the NAU Center for American Indian Economic Development (CAIED), featured nine passionate pitches from aspiring entrepreneurs, each showcasing their unique business ideas and visions for the future.

The YC SBDC played a vital role in supporting this competition, offering a comprehensive workshop series over the summer at the Tunlii Community Center. Thirteen participants benefited from one-on-one consulting, helping them refine their pitches and develop solid business plans. Workshops included topics to build a business plan, financial forecasting, and marketing and sales planning. The series wrapped up with pitch deck preparation and presentation practice.

YC SBDC is excited to continue our partnership with all participants as they grow and expand their enterprises.

This advanced certification exceeds national standards in fire service training, further enhancing the expertise and quality of instruction within our academy.






 OLLI in Prescott discussed the Water program on October 11 – an important topic for our region.
