#### School of Business and Computer Systems (BUCS)

Edmund Bushman, CSA Instructor and Department Chair for BUCS, reports in the Fall 2019 semester their division considered the adoption of the Open Educational Resource (OER) content for CSA 110 (Computer Information Systems) and CSA 126 (Microsoft Office) courses to combat the high cost of textbooks for students. In the Spring 2020 semester, after completion of the OER training, construction of the two courses began. CSA 110 was rolled out in the Summer 2020 semester, and CSA 126 started in Fall 2020 semester. The estimated savings to students so far, based on the cost of the textbook from the YC bookstore is \$43,730! Feedback from the students has been very positive on the OER content. They engaged 31 SOL participants while conveying the essence of developing a Motivational Leadership style. This included benefits for, not only creating a motivated and productive work environment, but also helping people believe in themselves, and giving people confidence to achieve goals, and focus on other peoples' strengths and not weaknesses.

  Certificate (RMC). JJ McCormick, Prescott Public Information Officer, led her Student
  Intern Marketing Team in the creation of a Retail Management Certificate (RMC)
  promotional video requested by Fry's Food Stores headquarters for internal use at
  employee-centered events and activities. Cynthia Heneage, Verde Valley Public
  Information Officer, displayed her expertise in the creation of an employee/YC RMC
  student testimonial promotional video for Safeway. Cynthia transformed over 30 minutes
  of employee/student interview video into a 3-minute masterpiece highlighting the
  enormous benefits that come with completing the Retail Management Certificate at
  Yavapai College.
- The College Honors Program (CHP) has embraced the online learning environments and taken on several online service projects:
  - CHP has launched virtual tutoring for K-12 students. 22 honor students provide 1-hour tutoring slots each week. Those being tutored range from 3rd -12th grade and come from public and private schools from throughout Yavapai County. While math is the most popular subject, students are also benefiting from CHP's knowledge in History, Science and English. This innovative and far-reaching community service project is CHP's way to give back to the community in a safe and effective manor while helping local students during these challenging educational times.
  - The Dollar for Scholars Fun Run just completed its 3rd year, by going viral. Through the virtual environment, students created a Just Giving campaign. CHP/PTK students created individual fundraising pages and committed to completing an activity during the month-long campaign. This year's event raised \$5027.00 from 81 donors. Contributions ranged from \$1.00-\$500.00. Proceeds from the virtual fundraiser help to fund student scholarships.
  - For its 2020 theme, College Honors Program is tackling the timely topic of <u>Race in America</u>. Students are reading and discussing 2 books – So You



*Want to Talk About Race* and *Between the World and Me*. CHP will also welcome guest speakers, **Professors Laura Cline and Dr. Jennifer Jacobson**.

### School of Career and Technical Education

• **Robert Smith,** Welding instructor, reports that the welding fabrication class is making new benches for the welding booths and gas welding stations. The student designed benches include skills in computerized plasma cutting (Note YC Logo), MIG welding, painting, design, and overall fabrication. This project will save the college several thousand dollars in replacing stool costs.



• **Marnee Zazueta**, YC Agriculture instructor, holds a catfish grown in the hatchery as part of a program Aquaculture students are doing with the USGS and AZ Game and Fish. This program will determine whether Catfish are predators of Chub, which are an endangered species in Arizona. The catfish are used in predatory experiments. The theory: hypothesis is that as the chub are spawned in captivity over many generations (without predators), the natural instinct of self-preservation can/will be lost. YC will receive new chub for tank 2 this week and will harvest tank 1 at that time. The unique situation YC students found is many chub in tank 1 WITH the catfish. So the experiment is expanding to compare instincts of both the chub who survived with the catfish with those without.





• The YC construction program is building a new mock-up house frame inside CTEC to teach plumbing and electrical year around avoiding deterioration on the framework.



• Culinary Program **Chef Robert Barr** reports that the Sedona Culinary Institute did a Live Zoom, cooking segment on The Creation of Award Winning, Ultimate Mac-N-Cheese. 

- Library staff designed and created the Verde Library Fall 2020 Collection of magnets, mirrors, and buttons. These will be used along with other promotional materials at curbside and when individuals sign up for library cards.





- Assessment Day 2020 was held on Friday, September 18<sup>th</sup> for all full-time faculty at Yavapai College. Yavapai College supports the assessment process by supporting an annual Assessment Day in September hosted by the Office of Instructional Support, the Office of Institutional Effectiveness and Research, and the following faculty committees: Student Learning Outcomes Assessment, Curriculum, and General Education. Activities during assessment day are designed as both professional development in the area of course and program assessment and a work session for faculty to engage in dialogue that allow them to discuss assessment results, complete reports, and to make assessment plans for the coming academic year.
- Yavapai College's annual renewal application was approved by the AZ State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (AZ SARA) Council On Tuesday, September 15<sup>th</sup>. The State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA) is an agreement among member states, districts and territories that establishes comparable national standards for interstate offering of postsecondary distance education courses and programs. This means that Yavapai College has approval for offering distance education courses to students that live outside of Arizona in other SARA approved states.
