
September 2022 Board Highlights

Career and Technical Education

Professor Justin Brereton from Agribusiness participated in a week-long internship
learning advanced plant tissue culture and micropropagation techniques at Lea Fine
Gardens in North Carolina in June. This internship opportunity allowed Professor
Brereton to perfect his skills in propagation specifically targeted to plants that will aid in
combating erosion. Through advanced cloning techniques, Professor Brereton can
capitalize on the tissue culture equipment located at the Chino Center to conduct student
centric research in cloning plants for erosion control.









Professor Justin Brereton was awarded the Postsecondary CTE Educator of the year at the recent AZCTE Conference held in Tucson. Professor Brereton has done a stellar job in creating many enhancements to the Agriculture program at Yavapai College where he specializes in Horticulture and Viticulture classes. He has figured out ways to develop hybrid instruction which allows students greater flexibility in taking classes, while still be able to maintain jobs which keep them afloat. He also implemented a flex schedule for students to complete their lab work in the greenhouse, allowing them to attend labs around their work schedules. He has been engaged in research projects with students which include testing fruit varietals for cold weather tolerance in conjunction with the University of Arizona, as well as innovative greenhouse hydroponic fruit and vegetable production where the products are on sold contracts with local restaurants. This innovative model has allowed students to learn the entire process of fruit and vegetable production from plant to table. The produce is also sold on Saturdays at the Prescott Farmers market. Restaurants who use YC produce advertise the college on their menus, leading to a continued stream of solid enrollment. Professor Brereton will now compete for the regional award, and if he wins, he will go on as a national award finalist.





- Twenty-six YC Employees from around the college attended the annual state CTE conference in Tucson in July. They had the opportunity to participate in many workshops in their areas, including Student Services, Automotive, Manufacturing, Drones, Leadership, Agriculture, Welding, and more. It was the first conference held in 2 years due to COVID and produced record attendance.
- Gunsmithing instructor, Allen Magarrell, recently received a generous donation to the Gunsmithing program of a Ceracoate paint booth oven. Ceracoating of firearms is quickly becoming the industry coating standard. This donation allows YC to stay current with industry changes.
