Welcome nursing students to the Spring 2020 semester. Currently there are 197 enrolled nursing program students. There are program nursing students at Prescott and Verde Valley locations, including a new cohort of 48 first semester students! Yavapai College (YC) Nursing graduates continue to be successful on the Arizona NCLEX-RN Licensure with an annual pass rate (four quarter average) of 93.51% for 2019*. The YC NCLEX – RN national pass rate for 2019 is 90% * surpassing the national pass rate of 86%.

Currently, according to Arizona Board of Nursing there are 94,936 RN's practicing in Arizona. An increased demand for RNs in Arizona's future to be 28,000 more needed by 2025*.

Located on *myYC* for student review is BSN Concurrent Enrollment Programs (CEP) and BSN completion information regarding articulation transfer opportunity agreements with University of Phoenix, ASU, NAU, GCU, and many others with options that best fit student schedules. Connect with your Advisor for CEP options.

Students seeking Emergency Relief funds should connect with "I am YC" for assistance. There are several opportunities and monetary resources available to assist students. The Nursing Program Emergency Relief funds have been fully utilized for the 2019-2020 academic year.

To keep updated on what's happening and what you'll need to know, please check your YC scholar email regularly. You'll find our Newsletter \Box , email blast notifications of important program updates, and other time sensitive correspondence on your YC email account. Also, please keep your voicemail box open to receive important messages as needed.

Castle Branch

It is the Nursing Program policy to complete CPR and TB renewals <u>prior to semester start</u> if the expiration date will occur during the term.

Spring 2020 semester dates: January 13- May 8

If the expiration date needs to be re-set to allow you to upload a renewal of your CPR certification or TB test results, there are several ways that you can connect with Castle Branch to request this.

A new renewal date request will take 24-72 hours to be completed in the Castle Branch system. Please plan accordingly.

When making your request, please use a phrase such as: "I need to update my (TB, CPR) information. Can you populate my renewal early?" This is how Castle Branch understands what you are requesting them to do. Otherwise, they may state that the requirement is not expired and does not need to be renewed per the requirement guidelines. To make a request, you may use one of the top three ways described here:

Ways Students can Connect to Castle Branch

- 1. Call 888-666-7788 (Choose option 1 and follow prompts to choose the queue that best fits your need). If a hold time extends past your availability, use the option to request a call back.. Representatives do not leave for the day until every number is called back.
- 2. Email <u>servicedesk.cu@castlebranch.com</u>. Use this method when your request is <u>not</u> urgent. It can take a few days to get a response back.

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- 3. Submit a web inquiry on your account. You can do this by logging in to your existing account and clicking the orange **Need Help?** Button in the upper right hand corner and then click **Submit Support Inquiry**.
- 4. Chat via instant message with a representative. You can chat by logging in and clicking the orange **Need Help?** Button and then click "Chat With Us" This option is for <u>general questions</u> on how to navigate Castle Branch and access information in the system like the "To Do List Summary Report". This would <u>NOT</u> be used for requesting changes to your account. Castle Branch also offers FAQ Videos for general type questions.

Fingerprint Clearance Cards are now part of your Castle Branch tracker. A copy of the front and back of the card must be uploaded as one document.

Flu immunizations for the 2019/2020 flu season must be available for review in your Castle Branch account before the clinical start date. **For students who did not receive an immunization for the 2018/2019 season**, the immunization is required <u>prior to clinical orientation paperwork submission</u> deadlines.

We are excited to continue offering a multilevel simulation experience for Spring 2020 for students who missed a clinical day. The multilevel simulation will be held on the Prescott Campus on MAY 1st for both Verde and Prescott students who were absent from clinical.

Effective Spring 2020, the simulation committee is excited to offer students on both campuses the ability to participate in open multilevel simulation sessions during the semester. Sign-ups will be posted within the skills lab on both campuses on a first come first serve basis. Depending upon the response, additional open multilevel simulation sessions will be offered in coming semesters. These open simulation sessions offer the student an opportunity to practice clinical reasoning in a safe, non-threatening environment that promotes collegiality and professional communication. Please see your simulation coordinators, Dr. Durham on Prescott, or Dr. Ritter on Verde for more details.

The multilevel simulation experience in the Fall of 2019 provided the opportunity for 20 students to care for a standardized patient; again the feedback was overwhelmingly positive and the experience was well received. Stay tuned for more information in the days ahead.

ATI Integration

ATI Nursing Educational Resources are used throughout the Nursing Program, in every semester and is required for all nursing program students.

Students have a wealth of resources to support and supplement their learning through utilization of the ATI Resources.

Students purchase the online materials and resources through ATI 1-800-367-4762. The materials are financial aid-able. Students are required to purchase their ATI materials in order to maintain enrollment in their nursing program courses. Students that have not purchased their materials within two weeks of the course start date will not be permitted to progress in the course.

ATI will provide the access code directly to the student.

Students should direct ATI Resource questions to their course/clinical Nursing Instructor; the Nursing Instructor will be very helpful. The fee amount will be specific to the semester of the nursing program student.

ATI student orientation and informational meetings are scheduled on Verde and Prescott during the week of January 20th, 2020. ATI representatives will be visiting classrooms and will also be available for Q & A in dedicated spaces on each campus.
