A Note from the Director of Nursing

Welcome nursing students to the SPRING 2024 semester. Currently, there are approximately 200 students enrolled in the nursing program at the Prescott and Verde Valley locations, including a new cohort of 60 first-semester students! This is a 24% increase from previous semesters, thanks to a Nursing Education Investment grant (HB2691). In addition to the new grant, the nursing program has several new updates.

We received full approval from the Higher Learning Commission in October to start a baccalaureate degree in nursing in the spring. This BSN will be post-licensure, meaning applicants must possess an unencumbered RN license to apply. YC graduates will be credited with 68.5 credits for their AAS degree. The nursing major courses consist of 30.5 credits plus 3 credits of statistics, leaving an additional 18 credits of electives to be completed for a total of 120 credits for a BSN degree.

We have opened LPN-RN advance placement applications for admission to the third semester. The nursing program is collaborating with Allied Health to offer an LPN step-out option for nursing students completing year 1 of the program or those students who may be unsuccessful in the third or fourth semester. The step-out option will become more seamless as we transition Peds/OB theory into 2nd semester (rather than in the third semester).

Yavapai College (YC) Nursing graduates continue to be successful on the NCLEX-RN Licensure with a first-time pass rate of 87.64% for 2023*. These rates remain comparable to the 90.39% pass rate for the state of Arizona and the 88.56% pass rate nationally.

As of January 2024, Yavapai College is ranked 11th out of 33 nursing schools across Arizona**, according to www.registerednursing.org. This ranking is up from 12th in 2023 and based on current and historical NCLEX pass rates.



The <u>Nursing Program Student Handbook</u> for 2023-2024 is available for students to review on the yc.edu/nursing. Students are responsible each semester for knowing and following the contents of the most current Nursing Program Student Handbook and reviewing all YC e-NEWSFLASH communications or emails from <u>nursing@yc.edu</u> for important program announcements and policy updates.

As you know, the program transitioned from ATI resources and standardized exams to NurseThink. The NurseThink product will offer NCLEX Preview (1-day course to learn how to use the NurseThink product) and Review (2-day course for NCLEX review) and CJSim (2700 NGN questions, hundreds of cases 900 interactive EHRs). The book bundle includes The Notebook (hard copy – note-taking system), Conceptual Clinical Cases eBook (hundreds of clinical judgment questions, 32 case studies with debriefing, reflection, and conceptual quizzes), and NCLEX-RN Conceptual Review eBook (1000 NGN questions, 35 patient assignments, audio/video resources). In addition, ExamSoft houses the platform to deliver the CJExams from NurseThink. CJExams offers standardized assessments for Fundamentals, Pharmacology, Women's Health, Pediatrics, Mental Health, Medical-Surgical I and a Readiness Exam. These exams will be integrated throughout the curriculum.

Please accept our apologies for the transition that was, well, not very smooth. It was apparent that many difficulties stemmed from incorrect emails. Note: all students will have a scholar email address (student.name@scholar.yc.edu). This can be confirmed in the student's YC Portal. Where the confusion lies is with Microsoft products. Oftentimes, your username for Microsoft apps will be student.name@yc.edu. It is your responsibility to make sure that your scholar email account and mailing address are always current and up to date with the department. You can do this by changing your contact information in your myYC portal account so that it may be verified.

Beginning in the Fall for the 2024-2025 academic year, the NurseThink resources will be integrated into tuition fees.

Another change that you will notice in the program is that students can now register for nursing classes when registration opens. Students no longer need to wait for the program to email their CRNs to register. This will enable students to self-schedule their courses and select their clinical placements. There is one caveat/disclaimer: Students who start in the evening cohort will always have first priority to register for the evening courses/clinical. Students who want to move from evening to day or days to evening must schedule an appointment with the Nursing Director to ensure availability.

Lastly, due to room conflicts/scheduling, the Nursing Pinning Ceremony will be on Thursday, May 2nd at 5 pm. Upcoming pinning dates are December 13, 2024, and May 16, 2025.

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


From the Desk of Summer Hawk, Prescott Instructional Support Specialist 928-776-2017 summer.hawk@yc.edu

Clinical Updates:

Health requirements are to be current throughout the entire semester. This new requirement from our clinical agencies will be in effect immediately. Students must meet all clinical compliance requirements by established due dates to be eligible to proceed into the clinical setting. Students who do not comply risk being administratively withdrawn from the clinical setting by the Nursing Director.

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There are two clinical tracking systems used in the nursing program. CastleBranch is a clinical tracking system that is used by the YC Nursing Program to ensure students are up to date on their clinical requirements. CastleBranch is first implemented upon admission to the program for students to purchase their background checks, drug screens, and the clinical health requirement checklist and must be maintained throughout the course of the nursing program.

My Clinical Exchange is used by the clinical agencies for 2nd, 3rd, and 4th-semester clinical requirements. Students must complete the required hospital onboarding modules in MyCE before orientation at the clinical site. Both sites must be maintained while in the nursing program.

N95 Mask Fit Testing Update

N95 Masks Fit testing requirements for clinical rotations have been lifted at all clinical locations. This requirement is subject to change; please make sure to check your YC scholar email regularly for any updates or time-sensitive notices.
