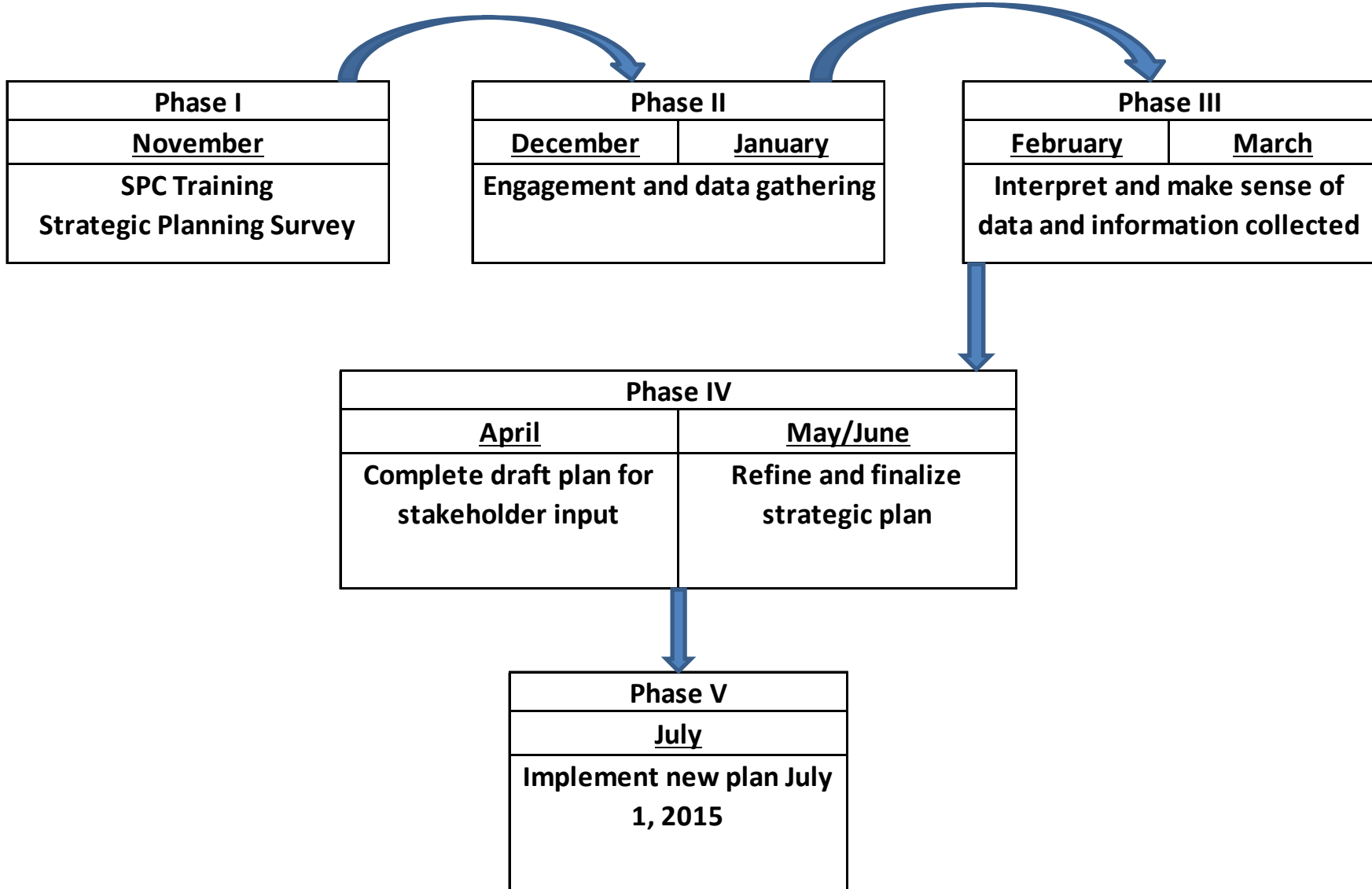

## Community College Enrollment



- Total Number of Colleges 1,132
- Fall 2009 Credit Enrollment 8.0M
- Fall 2013 Credit Enrollment 7.5M
- Three straight years of declining enrollment

## Politics/Economics



- Unemployment 5.8%
- By 2020, nearly two out of every three U.S. jobs will require some postsecondary education and training
- 30% or 42 million jobs will require education and training beyond high school but less than a Bachelor's degree
- Higher Education Act renewal
- Focus on Completions and Employment
- Financial Aid and Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) – 58% of CC students receive financial aid

- Population Growth Rate Slowing
- Changes in Net & Natural Migration

# Arizona

- Population growth rate .82% annually
- Net natural change declining over time
- Arizona is experiencing a decline in high school graduates
- Hispanic population accounts for 30% of AZ population
- Hispanic population projected to be fastest growing ethnicity
- Median age 36
- 40% of AZ population is older than 44; 16% age 65+
- Overall, AZ population is projected to age over the next three decades



## State Appropriations



- FY08 – FY13 Arizona reduced higher education funding by 50.4%
- FY12 Yavapai College's State aid reduced by \$3.4M
- FTSE reimbursement FY13 \$226 vs FY07 \$1,122
- FY14 AZ provided additional funding for STEM programs
- Funding is not expected to return to pre-recession levels in near future

## Economy

- Unemployment Rate 6.9%
- Arizona employment situation improving, albeit at a slower rate than predicted earlier
- Residential real estate markets in Arizona are showing an improvement by various indicators.

# Yavapai County



## Demographics

- Population growth rate .34% annually
- Yavapai County growth is entirely due to migration from other states
- P-12 Enrollment declined 4% between 2010 and 2013
- Hispanic population accounts for 14% of County population
- Hispanic population projected to be fastest growing ethnicity
- Median age 50
- 56% of County population is older than 44; 30% age 65+

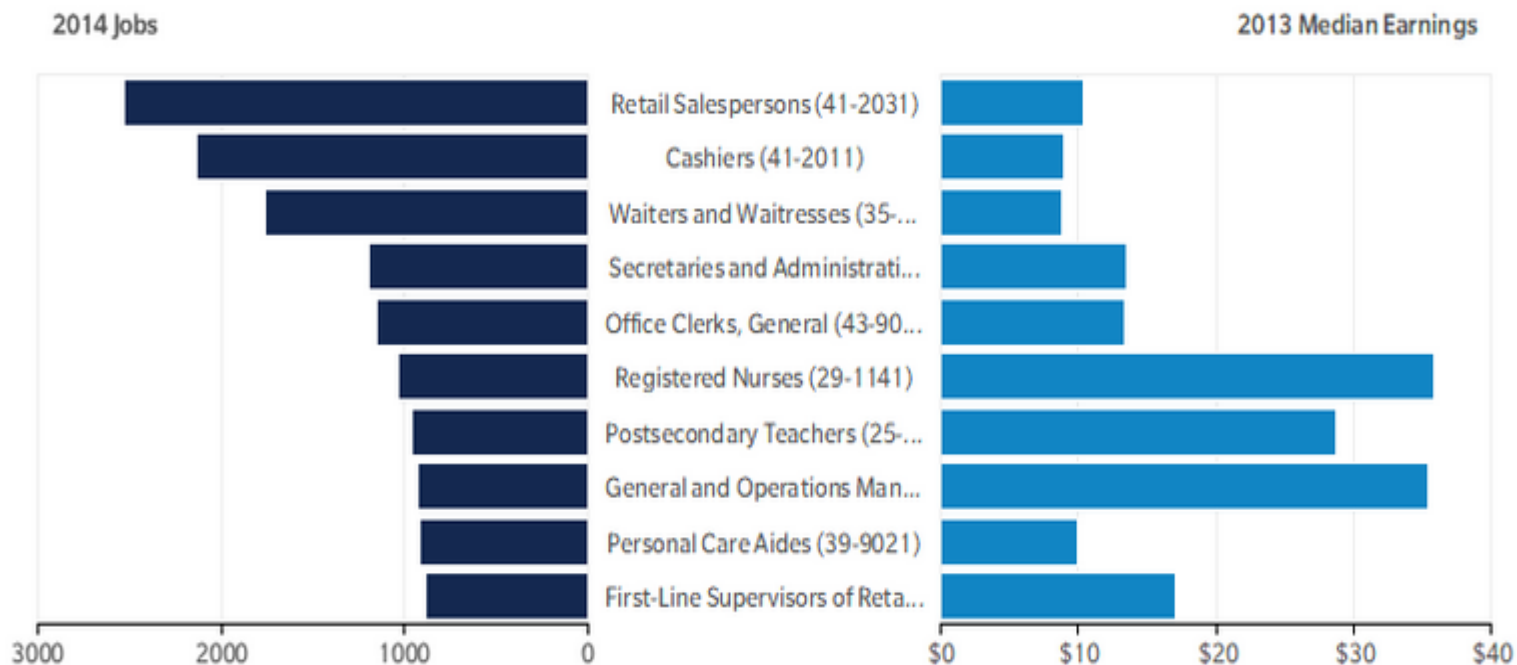
