

Claire Armstrong's Fall Horticulture class had a guest speaker recently –
Kathryn Crew, owner of AZ Mushrooms. She showed students how to grow mushrooms.
Each student put together their tabletop grow bags made of sterilized and colonized hardwood sawdust. Student chose the variety of mushrooms they wanted to grow; some will harvest in a month, while others will harvest around winter break. Mushrooms growing in a garden or lawn are signs of a healthy growing environment, so we will continue to look for ways to grow mushrooms on campus.
