

March and April Events


All events are open to all YC students and are supported through strong partnerships with other departments – Learning Center, REDC, Financial Aid, YC Pipeline and Strong Foundations




SSS TRIO Student Alyssa Orozco created two (2) videos to encourage folks to bid at the SSS TRIO Silent Auction.






Alcohol & Drug Prevention Strategies

"Walk With Me, Be Drug Free!"






YC Focus Group & D.E.A. Operation Engage Town Hall

In 2020, the federal Drug Enforcement Administration launched a pilot program called "Operation Engage." Operation Engage is an effort to collaborate with community stakeholders and bring federal resources to help deal with problem drug issues. Yavapai County is one of eleven Operation Engage regions in the United States.

On April 7th, the Health. Wellness and Resiliency team facilitated a Focus Group to develop topics for the Operation Engage Town Hall event (planned for later in the month). 15 YC students and community members participated in the Focus Group.

On April 21st, Yavapai College hosted a Town Hall to develop solutions to community drug issues. Members of the Yavapai College Health. Wellness and Resiliency team helped organize and coordinate the event, which was attended by approximately 50 YC students and community members.







Clarkdale Campus "Safe Summer Break"

On April 26th, the Yavapai Health and Wellness Team hosted a "Safe Summer Break" information and activity event in the pavilion on the Clarkdale campus. Students and staff members were given the opportunity to learn about the risks of underage drinking, excessive alcohol consumption, and the harmful outcomes of experimenting with alcohol and street drugs during social gatherings.

"Dump the Drugs"

On April 30th, the Yavapai College Health, Wellness and Resiliency team partnered with MATFORCE and D.E.A. Operation Engage to host an Rx drug take-back event at the YC Prescott campus. Since 2008, over 40,000 pounds of unwanted/unused Rx drugs have been collected and disposed of safely in Yavapai County.

The "Dump the Drugs" program keeps harmful medications out of our water supply and out of the wrong hands. 50.5 pounds of unwanted/unused Rx drugs were collected at the April 30th event.
