AJS 295, 292 (Deletion)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Motioned to approve the Law Enforcement Certificate, AJS 295 and 292 together. • The Committee questioned how course fees affect tuition costs and extra costs associated with the program and outside provider (NARTA). • Jason Ebersole reassured the committee that there are no extra costs involved to students or NARTA. It is about completion of the program. • Approved unanimously.

CNC 260</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Committee discussed the lab hour ratio for CNC 260 being different than other CNC courses. • Mike Schaible confirmed that lab hours should be changed and consistent with other CNC courses in the program. • Approved Unanimously. <p>2. Brewing Technology Certificate</p> <p>3. BRW 100, 110, 130, 140, 150, 192, 195, 299</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Motioned to approve the deletion of the Brewing Certificate and all corresponding courses together. • No discussion. Approved unanimously. <p>4. Semiconductor Manufacturing Technician Certificate</p> <p>5. SMT 100, 105, 205, 210, 215</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Motioned to approve the Semiconductor Manufacturing Technician Certificate and corresponding courses together. • The Committee discussed the foundation of the program and the future opportunities it has for apprenticeship for students. • Approved unanimously. <p>6. There were a couple of learning outcomes not connected to the course content. • CBT 121 was reviewed to identify the acronym PV in the learning outcomes so it was clear for students. 	<p>CBT 114 and 116 were fixed during the meeting to ensure course content and learning outcomes were aligned correctly. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Committee discussed the path for current students with the changes to the program. Heather Mulcaire said there should be no issues and she has reviewed progression for current students with an advisor. • Approved unanimously. <p>8. Media and Extended Realities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lindsay Masten provided a brief overview of the changes to the program and oversight history of the program. • The current proposal is a modification that is deleting courses that are in the Bachelor of Design. The plan is to modify Media and Extended Realities in the next curriculum cycle to update it, offer current and more robust courses. • Media and Extended Realities Certificate will have current modifications, but will not be offered in 2026-27. • The Committee had a lengthy discussion about program and course offerings that are not currently available to students and whether to sunset programs and courses that are not going to be offered in the current cycle. • The Committee discussed the new AMP Committee process and timeline to roll out new curriculum. The process allows time to have programs and courses be approved through all committees and outside entities, including HLC and DOE, in order for new programs to be ready and available to students. • The Committee discussed inactive programs and courses being problematic for students and issues it may cause for advising. • Dr. Berry talked about YC taking a proactive approach to get curriculum ready to offer programs and courses in the future. • The Committee discussed not putting anything into the catalog until everything was ready to support offering new programs and courses. This then began a larger discussion about managing curriculum and appropriate timing with scheduling when everything is approved and supported monetarily. • The Committee talked about the ability to hide programs and courses and then activate them when available to students.
