

- Matches your information to scholarships you may be eligible to receive





 What is your most meaningful achievement and how does it relate to your field of study and your future goals?

To get started, try answering these questions:

- What has made you who you are?
- What does success look like to you?



Essay Questions

Essay Question #2 (250 words maximum)

Choose one of the three prompts below:

- Describe an adult or mentor who had an influence on your life.
- What topic, idea, or concept do you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time? Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- Describe one change you would like to make in your community.



Tips for Writing a Top-Notch Essay

- Be positive, truthful, and descriptive
- Reflect on your life goals and career aspirations
- Share your unique story
- Check for spelling errors
- Have a friend of family member review your responses for grammatical errors and content



Scholarship Reviewers <u>love</u> when students...

- Tell their unique story
- Use descriptive words
- Are honest
- Share challenges
- Stick to the word count
- Check for grammar mistakes and typos



What happens next?

- Mid March and Mid May deadlines, so apply NOW!
- Students are notified of scholarship awards by email
- Students are encouraged to write a thank you note to donors
- Scholarship payments are sent directly to institutions
- Scholarships can be contingent on a final High School transcript
- Some scholarships are renewable each year read the f print on how to renew a scholarship
