To be eligible, **ALL** agencies wishing to apply must be incorporated in the State of **Arizona** and recognized as a **non-profit (501-C 3)** status) by the IRS prior to application deadline of April 13, 2018. The (501(c)(3) cannot be pending. Include a copy of your IRS 501(c)(3) letter of nonprofit status determination.

It is mandatory that the applicants appear at the **Acker Trust Board meeting** when applications are being considered, for a **five-minute oral presentation** to the Board. Organizations not represented at this meeting will not be considered. It is the responsibility of the applicant organization to confirm the presentation date by contacting Recreation Services staff at 777.1552 or the address listed in Item 2 (an approximate time table is attached).

### III. ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION

#### A. Eligible Applicants

In keeping with the **authority provided by Congress under ACWIA**, grants under this program will be awarded to a **partnership of private and public sector entities**. Grants will be awarded to the lead applicant of a regional workforce partnership, which will serve as the grantee and have overall fiscal and administrative responsibility for the grant. Eligible lead applicants must be **public or nonprofit organizations** that: 1) meet the definition of one of the three types of eligible entities described below; and 2) include at least one representative of each of the four types of required regional workforce partnership entities, which collectively form the “regional workforce partnership.”

### Eligibility Requirements

- Any Arizona 501(c)(3) organization, government agency, and tribal entity that operates with fiscal accountability and responsibility. Religious organizations may apply for funding of non-sectarian programs.
- Organizations must serve the residents within the geographic boundaries of Sedona and the Verde Valley.
- Organizations must be in good standing with the IRS at the time of application submission or submitted application(s) will be declined.
- Organizations must demonstrate a non-discrimination policy regarding staff, employment, governing board, and service delivery based on race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, disability or national origin, and provide evidence of the policy.

Applicant Eligibility. Under 20 CFR 687.120(b), the following entities are eligible to apply for QUEST DWGs:

- A. States;
- B. Outlying areas;
- C. Indian tribal governments as defined by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5122(6)).

**Who Is Eligible to Apply:** For-profit Organizations Other Than Small Businesses, Native American Tribal Orgs, not Federally recognized Tribal Governments, Other or Additional Information (See below), State Controlled Institutions of Higher Ed

**More on Eligibility:** Applications may only be submitted by: (1) public secondary schools; (2) public or private nonprofit junior and community colleges; (3) institutions of higher education; or (4) nonprofit organizations. ### Eligible Applicants and Demonstrated Effectiveness

Eligible providers, in adherence to WIOA, are organizations with *demonstrated effectiveness\** in providing adult education and literacy activities and may include:

- A volunteer literacy organization
- An institution of higher learning

### Project Grant Eligibility:

1. Eligible applicants include private nonprofit 501(c)3 organizations; local, tribal, and state governments; institutions of the federal government; and academic institutions;
2. Applicant organization must have an active SAM Cage Code See pg 2.
3. Applicant must be in “good standing” with Arizona Humanities, i.e., you do not have an overdue grant report or a previously defaulted grant.
