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Child Care Needs Survey

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I. Introduction

In spring 2004, a survey was developed to solicit community input for the new Del E. Webb Family Enrichment Center. As a follow-up to preliminary information collected, a second survey was administered in spring 2006. The objective of the study was to provide a complete, accurate and unbiased measure and clarify the child care needs in the Prescott area. The elements measured include:

- Determining the level of interest in a child care facility on the Prescott Campus
- Determining the number of children and ages
- Scheduling needs of parents
- Funding and payment options

The questionnaire was developed by Yavapai College Institutional Research Department with input from the college's Early Childhood Education program.

The 2006 survey was first introduced at the Family Enrichment Center ground breaking in April 2006. Surveys were also available at the circulation desk in the Yavapai College Prescott Library. An online version of the survey was also developed and available on the Yavapai College website. A total of 254 completed surveys were returned (207 online responses and 47 paper surveys). Of those who returned the survey, 186 had children age five or younger. Ninety-four of the survey respondents indicated they have children between the ages of six and 12 years.

II. Findings

Status of Respondents

- The majority (75%) of the respondents are students.
- Nineteen (7%) of the respondents self-identified themselves as community members.

Relationship to Child

- Parents represent 93% of all respondents with the largest share of respondents (62%) married parents.
- Included in the other category: respondents self-identified themselves as foster parents, aunts, same-sex parents, cohabitating parents and joint parents.

Ages of Children

Parents were asked to provide the ages of their children (as of January 2007). More than one-half (57%) are preschoolers. Due to the January 2007 stipulation, infants may be understated.

Days of Week Child Care Would be Used

Monday through Friday scheduling is preferred by parents with both full day and half day schedules.

Likelihood of Using Yavapai College Child Care Services

Seven out of ten respondents would use Yavapai College child care services. Twenty-six percent are unsure. Only 4% indicated that they would not use YC child care services. More than one-half (52%) want year-round services.

Schedule Considerations

Survey respondents were asked the type of child care schedule that would be needed. While the times varied as to the earliest or latest schedule that would work for them, more than one-half (51%) need child care services prior to 7:30 a.m. and 43% need services after 5:30 p.m.

A review of survey comments show a few needing times outside those suggested above. One respondent needed 6:30 a.m. and some indicated the need for at least 6 or 6:30 p.m. A few expressed the need to 9 p.m. when classes are out.

Opinions on Night Classes and Funding Issues

Survey respondents were asked to indicate their level of agreement with statements on night classes and funding and payment options.

From the above data, it appears that a large number are interested in night classes (62%) and the availability of child care on campus (58%).

Relative to funding and payment, there is a strong need for financial aid (59%) and the willingness to apply for scholarship monies (81%).

Price Willing to Pay

Respondents were asked to indicate the amount that they are willing to pay for Yavapai College childcare services. With interest in full-time (55%) and part-time (45%) usage split, the amounts they are willing to pay vary. The following summarizes the weekly prices by age group.

- Infants: Thirty-nine responded with input. The range was from a low of \$15/week to a high of \$210/week.
- Toddlers: Fifty-five responded with input. The range was from a low of \$10/week to a high of \$210/week.
- Preschoolers: Sixty-six responded with input. The range was from a low of \$10/week to a high of \$210/week.

III. Conclusion

There appears to be strong interest in a child care facility on the Prescott Campus. Seventy percent of the respondents indicated they would use child care on the Prescott Campus. Approximately 55% of the respondents indicated they would use the facility full-time and 45% part-time. More than one-half (54%) are interested in year-round services. In terms of funding and payment, 59% indicated they would use financial aid to help pay for the child care and 81% are willing to apply for whatever scholarship monies are available.
