Over the past month, these small performing ensembles have been touring the county, visiting high schools to raise awareness about the music department offerings for Yavapai College. Along with their directors, Dr. Joshua Harper and Chris Tenney, the groups are scheduled to perform for almost 500 students this semester alone. Last week's stop was Mingus Union High School in Cottonwood, where the groups performed and gave an informational presentation, and the week before they performed locally for both Chino Valley High School and Prescott High School's band and choir students, answering questions about classes, enrollment, scholarships, and more. The high schoolers were incredibly receptive to the groups, and a fantastic time was had by all.



Joshua Harper, Orchestra Conductor, says it was a pleasure to conduct Dr. **Craig** Ralston's production of *Jane Eyre: The Musical*, along with a fine cast comprised of mostly traditional students. He was so impressed with the quality of the production which featured student work from the scene shop, technical certificate program, and costume department. 




OLLI at Yavapai College in Prescott is getting back on the bus! After a hiatus, OLLI



- Enrollment for the Summer '23 term opened on April 22






#### College for Kids (C4K):



about five to seven days behind the historical dates this typically occurs. The
cold and wet winter kept the vines dormant a few days longer this year. So
far, no severe frost threats have emerged. We will continue to watch the
morning low temperatures until about mid-May closely.





 The vineyard received a new sprayer to start the season. The "Pak-Blast" is a top-of-the-market sprayer used in the wine industry. Students calibrated the spray heads and calculated the tractor speed based on the flow rate for various products. Fundraising from the Friends of the Southwest Wine Center helped make this equipment purchase possible.



 The YC Mini Class Construction class completed a doghouse. For the 2nd year, the doghouse was donated to the Verde Valley Human Society. This program is a partnership with Cottonwood Oak Creek School District middle school students and promotes the exploration of careers in various CTE programs.


