Promise & Early College



Even the smallest tarantula is noteworthy to Autumn Barger because it's part of a class project in AGS 282 Zoo and Domestic Animal Behavior.




Conduct


National Hispanic Heritage Month





Closing Ceremony!

Students of Leadership (SOL)




Students of Leadership joined a number of Yavapai County Food Pantries to fill their cupboards. Over 15,000 pounds of food items were processed during this 2 hour event.




In doing so, Yavapai College became **the first** higher education institution in the state to offer this state-of-the art technology. The ability to use a phone credential for door access and meal purchases is proving to be significant!
