

Lifelong Learning/OLLI/Community Education Highlights

 Prescott OLLI Winter Session/Enrollments began on January 25, with successful registrations for our 46 six-week classes, and 22 one-time workshops, totaling 1,140 enrollments. We have reached the highest enrollment by far since we began online offerings. We have seen a jump in individual enrollments – from an average of about 250




individuals participating online to 339 for the Winter Session. We instituted a "Holiday Membership" allowing OLLI members to gift a membership to someone else – and this has proven highly successful. OLLI members gifted 30 memberships to friends and family locally, and across the country. We have participants for our Winter session from Arkansas, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Iowa, Indiana, Michigan, North Carolina, New Jersey, Ontario (we have gone international!), Oregon, Tennessee, Texas, Washington and Wyoming. Oh, and of course, Arizona.



- Fundraising Campaign Prescott OLLI initiated a fundraising campaign in November, with a letter mailed out to current and former members, an online event "Prescott, AZ Mecca of Western Art" and other outreach to members.  Yavapai College Library is adding more titles to our new OverDrive ebook/eaudiobook database.



YC Performing Arts Center

The YC Performing Arts Center (YCPAC) will be doing a virtual screening of the documentary: M. C. Escher: A Journey to Infinity starting February 5th. Tickets are \$12 with part of that going to the PAC.

The story of world famous Dutch graphic artist M.C Escher (1898-1972). Equal parts history, psychology, and psychedelia, Robin Lutz's entertaining, eye-opening portrait gives us the man through his own words and images: diary musings, excerpts from lectures, correspondence and more are voiced by British actor Stephen Fry, while Escher's woodcuts, lithographs, and other print works appear in both original and playfully altered form. Two of his sons, George (92) and Jan (80), reminisce about their parents while musician Graham Nash (Crosby, Stills & Nash) talks about Escher's rediscovery in the 1970s. The film looks at Escher's legacy: one can see tributes to his work in movies, in fiction, on posters, on tattoos, and elsewhere throughout our culture; indeed, few fine artists of the 20th century can lay claim to such popular appeal.
