Residence Life


Meet the Residence Life Student Team!

Financial Aid

In addition to administering Title IV Financial Aid, the Financial Aid office has administered over 3,200 individual awards of CARES student grant funds to our students and families. Total Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund money paid to date equals **\$1,968,689.06**.

This money is earmarked to provide help to eligible students with additional expenses due to COVID-19. This includes help with tuition, room and board, book expenses, childcare, internet and other costs of attendance that are not usually covered by Title IV Financial Aid.

Trio/Vet Services

YC's TRIO Educational Talent Search Program was awarded an additional \$40,000 STEM grant from the Dept of Education which enabled first generation, low-income middle and high school students to participate in a three-week STEM summer program in June 2021.
