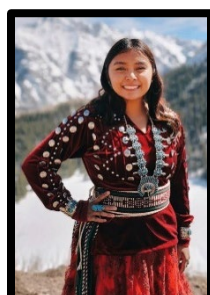
Podcast



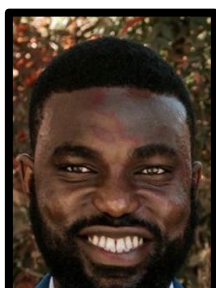

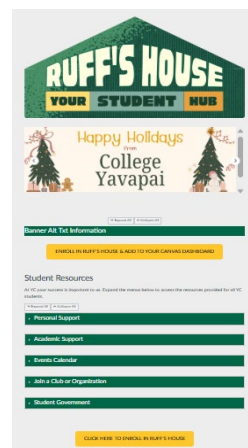
reminder that every life matters and that no veteran should feel alone.

Ruff's House recently received a thoughtful remodel designed to enhance both usability and accessibility for students.

The updates include a refreshed look with a new roof graphic added to the Canvas page, along with reorganized content placed into clear drop-down menus to make information easier to navigate. Alt text was added throughout the page to improve accessibility and ensure accommodation for all students. In addition, two new buttons were incorporated to allow students to add Ruff's House quickly and easily to their Canvas portal.



Promotion at the top of Canvas encouraged students to join, and as a result, there was a noticeable increase in students adding Ruff's House to their Canvas. Social media support has also taken off, with engaging promo videos and posts helping spread awareness and drive interest, further contributing to increased visibility and student engagement with Ruff's House.

YC Food Pantry

December was a busy and meaningful month at the YC Food Pantry. Before winter break on December 19, the pantry supported 39 student pantry visits, helping ensure students and their families had access to nutritious food during a critical time of year.

In partnership with YCSA and OLLI, the pantry distributed **45** holiday food boxes, each accompanied by a \$25 grocery store gift card, providing both immediate support and flexibility for families.

YCSA, FBLA, and Student Development staff wrapped the holiday food boxes, while Financial Aid staff and student pantry workers wrapped gifts for 37 children of YC students, helping bring a little extra joy to the season.
