Leadership with YC Roots – **Scott Ritchie**, the new Director of Aviation, and **Zack Chamberlin**, the new Aviation Specialist, are both YC alumni who are bringing their expertise and passion back to support the next generation of pilots.

Scott Ritchie – From YC NARTA Training to Director of Aviation

Scott Ritchie joins YC as the new Director of Aviation, bringing with him a wealth of experience in both aviation and education. His extensive career includes earning FAA Commercial Pilot and Flight Instructor Certificates with Airplane, Multi-Engine, and Instrument ratings, as well as 20+ years of experience training pilots in both manned and unmanned aircraft.

But Scott's YC connection goes beyond aviation. He also completed the Northern Arizona Regional Training Academy (NARTA) in 2007 at YC to become a certified peace officer with the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office. This rigorous law enforcement training prepared him for service as a patrol deputy in the Eastern and Northern Area Commands, where he developed invaluable leadership, safety training, and



operational skills, all of which he now brings back to his role as Director of Aviation at YC.

Now, Scott has come full circle, returning to YC to lead and grow a program that is shaping the next generation of aviation professionals. He's looking forward to working with students and faculty to support the continued growth of the YC Aviation program and help students develop the skills they need for the industry.

Zack's Journey from YC Student to Aviation Leader – Zack has been actively involved in aviation since 2012, earning his Rotorcraft Flight Instructor Certification with an Instrument



Rating after learning to fly in Hawaii. In 2019, he enrolled in YC's UAS Program, earning his Associate of Applied Science in Aerospace Science in 2021.

During his time at CTEC, Zack was dedicated to student success, working in the TRIO Program under Carol Beard and later as a math proctor under Dr. Baker. His hard work and academic excellence earned him the prestigious All-Arizona Scholarship. Zack went on to Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, where he graduated with honors in 2023 with a Bachelor of Science in Aeronautics.

3 Building Career-Ready Skills – These competitions provide students with real-world experience, confidence, and networking opportunities, helping them stand out in their future careers.


A Two-Day Event – It's a big event, with the first days' competitions leading into the second day's leadership skills portion, which will take place during the first half of the day.

YC Law and Justice Students Take Learning Beyond the Classroom


Yavapai College Law and Justice Club members are making the most of Spring 2025 by actively engaging in hands-on experiences that bring their studies to life.

AJS: YC Justice Institute Supports Positive Police-Community Engagement

The Yavapai College Justice Institute continues its efforts to strengthen police and community relations through the Peace Officer Project. On March 5th and 6th, **Chief Tyran Payne** and **Jerald Monahan** provided comprehensive training to the entire Chino Valley Police Department, equipping officers and staff with tools to enhance engagement and collaboration within Yavapai County.

Encouraging Higher Education – As part of the training, Chief Payne and Monahan emphasized the value of continuing education, encouraging department employees to complete their Administration of Justice (AJS) AAS degrees at YC.

A Multi-Level Training Approach – The two-day training included:

- March 5: Leadership-focused training for police supervisors
- o March 5 (Evening): Presentation to City Council members and the Town Manager
- o March 6: Training for police officers and civilian staff
- March 6 (Afternoon): "Train the Trainer" session, allowing Chino Valley PD to sustain the program internally

This initiative reflects YC's commitment to professional development and community partnership, ensuring law enforcement agencies have the resources to foster positive engagement and long-term impact.

Side Note: Chief Payne's son is currently training at NARTA as a Chino Valley police recruit, continuing the family's dedication to public service.

Adult Basic Education (ABE)

YC ABE Department Secures \$70,000 in Grant Funding for VESL CDL Students

Exciting news for YC students training for careers in commercial driving! YC's Adult Basic Education (ABE) department has been awarded a \$70,000 IEL/CE+T (Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education + Training) supplemental grant through WIOA Title II Section 243 funds to support additional VESL (Vocational English as a Second Language) CDL students.

Expanding Opportunities – Despite receiving less than the initial request, This funding will allow **40 additional students** to receive **English language support alongside CDL training**, providing critical training and language support to help them succeed in the trucking industry.

Planning for Student Success – A revised annual budget is already in the works to ensure the funding directly benefits students and is used effectively.

This grant is another step toward helping YC students gain job-ready skills, complete their training, and move into high-demand careers. It strengthens YC's ability to support non-native English speakers in earning their CDL and accessing new career opportunities.

Small Business Development Center (SBDC)


Supporting Small Business Growth Across Yavapai County

The Yavapai College Small Business Development Center (SBDC) continues to expand its efforts to empower entrepreneurs and support local businesses throughout the county. Recent initiatives highlight the impact of SBDC programs in fostering business success:

- New Business Growth: Since October 1 (Federal Fiscal Year), SBDC has worked with clients to launch 32 new businesses and create 79 new jobs for Yavapai County residents.
- Showcasing Success: A newly updated SBDC website now features a dedicated Success Stories page, highlighting entrepreneurs who have benefited from SBDC services.
- Entrepreneurial Training: The first-ever DreamBuilder Cohort launched with over 20 registrations and 15 dedicated participants attending weekly to develop business plans, explore growth opportunities, and connect with additional support services.
- Access to Capital: This month, SBDC is hosting Access to Capital Workshops in Wickenburg and Sedona, in partnership with Arizona Capital Source, to help small business owners navigate funding opportunities.
