The event featured **26 carnival-style games**, **6 food trucks**, and sweet treats like cotton candy, Dippin' Dots, and freshly brewed coffee. Eleven Yavapai College departments and divisions sponsored five bouncy houses and a variety of interactive games, adding to the non-stop energy throughout the evening. Residence Life brought color with a crowd favorite: a HUGE Tie-Dye Pit experience.

The vibe was elevated by local DJ entertainment from Digital Realm Studios, with beats by Josh Orlando (Owner), and a dynamic live performance by Colby Jeffers, Valley Rapper sponsored by the Baha'i Association.

Thanks to incredible community support, the event remained completely FREE for youth 18 and under, promoted through radio spots, banners, posters, and the generosity of 9 community sponsors.
