Club RUSH





Neighborhood Food Gathering

SOL participated in the Prescott Neighborhood Food Gathering food project on Saturday, February 7th. This event happens every other month to help county-wide food banks. The collection resulted in the collection of 21,390 pounds of food.







Basic Needs Office

35 referrals were made to the Basic Needs Office in February. The majority of referrals were for food insecurity.

YC Food Pantry

The YC Food Pantry is experiencing an increase in student usage. 36 visits were booked in January and in February that jumped to 56. 13 visits were booked in the first week of March.

The next **Community Mobile Food Distribution** will be held on March 28th, from 10:00 – 1:00. All community members are welcome to drive through and pick up meat, dairy, bread, drinks and snacks.



Early College

Students from our Yavapai County schools arrived by the bus load, from as far away as Seligman, to participate in the annual CTE Day at CTEC.

Students rotated through the building, experiencing the different CTE programs offered through MICTED. Instructors shared highlights about their programs while pumping students up to take advantage of these free college opportunities while in high school.



On the Verde side of the mountain, students participated in Verde Valley Pathways to Careers where they explored Verde CTE programs and toured the Verde campus.



During the **All-Advisor Meeting**, Meghan Paquette enlightened the Student Development team by having them participate in an Unusual Uses activity, which required teams to conjure up the most creative uses for everyday objects (such as shoes, matches, paperclips). The goal of the activity was to help people break through the functional fixedness that often blinds us from finding unconventional solutions to problems.





Highland High School, one of the Early College out-of-county schools, invited Yavapai College to participate in their community college fair. Recruiting and Early College teamed up to entice students to consider YC as an option for taking discounted online courses

while in high school or choosing YC as their post-high school college of choice. Students were wooed by the cool climate of Prescott, residence halls, and abundant degree and certificate programs to choose from!
