

Program Overview

The Associate of Applied Science Degree in Nursing is a 24-month program.

The Licensed Practical Nurse to Registered Nurse Advanced Placement (LPN-RN AP) program is a 12-month program.

AAS RN and LPN - RN AP prepares students for entry-level positions as registered nurses. The program starts twice per year: in the fall semester and again in the spring semester. Students must complete 28 credit hours of pre-requisite courses and 40.5 credits of Nursing Program core courses.
