Internet Discount Program

If you're currently receiving a Pell grant, you'll most likely be eligible for a monthly discount on your internet service.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a U.S. government program to help households pay for internet service and connected devices like a laptop or tablet.

The benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet.

How to apply:

- 1. Go to **AffordableConnectivity.gov** and submit your application or print out a mail-in application.
- 2. Contact your internet provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some internet providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete.

If you currently receive any of the following public benefits, you will most likely qualify for the Internet connectivity discount:

- Food Stamps (SNAP)
- Medicaid (AHCCCS)
- Unemployment/EDD
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
